## How about doing a Parenting Course?

Being a parent isn't always easy which is why the Glosfamilies Directory is here to help. Below are some of the FREE group parenting courses held around the county, that will be starting in January 2019.



**Triple P - Positive Parenting Programme** - There are 2 courses available, Standard (0-12 years) and Teen (12 years +) It's an opportunity for parents to expand their toolbox of parenting ideas as well as meet with other parents to share experiences. Topics covered include the five aspects of positive parenting, why children behave the way they do and strategies to manage problem behaviour. The Teen course includes how to develop a good relationship with your teenager and dealing with risky behaviour. One-off workshop sessions also available on various topics.

**You, Me and Mum** - Supporting children and young people who have lived with domestic violence. A 10 week course for mothers which will help you understand how domestic violence affects you as a parent and how it affects your children.

**Solihull Approach Parenting Group** - A 10 week programme that helps parents/carers to understand their child's behaviour and support their relationships. It explores issues such as: tuning into children, exploring feelings, parenting styles, communication, temper tantrums, sleep patterns, behavioural difficulties.

**Incredible Years Programme (Webster Stratton)** - Suitable for parents who face challenging behaviour. 12 week programme -6 weeks positive parenting and 6 weeks positive discipline.

## Christmas Craft Project

*Doesn't this pipe cleaner snowflake look festive? Imagine a flurry of them decorating your window, or tree!*

**You will need:** 2 silver pipe cleaners and 3 blue pipe cleaners

**Instructions:** Cut the two silver pipe cleaners in half. Put one piece aside so you have 3. Twist these three pieces together in the centre so that you have a shape with six points (look at the photo above for help with this). Cut the blue pipe cleaners in half and then in half again. You will have 12 pieces. Twist these on to the silver base to decorate your snowflake.

If you want to hang your snowflake, take the piece of silver pipe cleaner you put aside, fold in half and twist the ends to one of the snowflake points to make a loop.

## Do you have a Two Year Old?

If your child is receiving free school meals, or you receive Universal Credit and have gross annual household earnings of no more than £15,400, you may be entitled to 15 hours per week for 38 weeks of the year of funded childcare. If eligible, funding would be available the term after the child's 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday.

Families may also be entitled to the funding if they meet one of the following criteria:

- Child has an **Education Health & Care Plan (EHCP)** or a current statement of special educational needs, or a **SEND My Plan +**.
- Child is in receipt of **Disability Living Allowance**.
- The Child is in the **care of the Local Authority**, they have left care through **special guardianship order, child arrangement order** or **adoption order**.

## County Lines

Children are being exploited by gangs involved in drug crime. County Lines gangs use children and vulnerable people to courier drugs and money. A young person who is involved in county lines activity might exhibit some of these signs:

- Persistently going missing from school or home, or being found out of area.
- Unexplained acquisition of money, clothes or mobile phones
- Excessive receipt of texts or phone calls
- Relationships with controlling, older individuals or gang association
- Leaving home or care without explanation
- Suspicion of self-harm, physical assault or unexplained injuries
- Parental concerns
- Significant decline in school performance
- Significant changes in emotional well-being

If you see something that doesn't feel right, or looks suspicious, concerning a child or young person you should report it by calling **101** or **999** in an emergency. Alternatively you can call **Crimestoppers** anonymously on tel **0800 555 111**
