<p><u>Where do you live?</u> Find out about homes. This could be Viking houses or homes on the water. Draw and label or make a model of the homes you have researched.</p>	<p><u>A day in the life.</u> Research what life would be like for a Viking and write a diary entry for them. It could be a child or perhaps an invader!</p>	<p><u>Let me entertain you.</u> Find out about Viking games. Write a set of instructions for either a Viking game or a water-based game. Illustrations would be a bonus!</p>
<p><u>Getting from A to B.</u> Find out about boats. This could be Viking longboats or modern boats. Draw and label or make your boat.</p>	<p><u>Read all about it!</u> Write a Viking newspaper article. It could be about one of the raids from the point of view of either attackers or defenders.</p>	<p><u>Wateraid.</u> Find out about charities that help provide water around the world. Present your research in a format of your choice. Perhaps a leaflet or a webpage about their work.</p>
<p><u>Water colours.</u> Find out about a water colour artist. Perhaps you would like to paint a water colour of your own?</p>	<p><u>Water consumption.</u> How much water do you use in a week? Can you find out and present your calculations? Can you design a survey to find out how other people use water?</p>	<p><u>Water conservation.</u> Design a poster or leaflet to urge people to save water.</p>
<p><u>School Visit</u> Write a persuasive letter to Mrs. Calder to convince her to take you on a water-based school trip.</p>	<p><u>Watery Music</u> Which composers used water as their inspiration? Find out about one of them. You might like to compose a piece of music or song of your own.</p>	<p><u>Water Creatures</u> Find out about an animal that lives in or under water. Present your research in a format of your choice.</p>
