HOMEWORK

- Reading is so important and it would be wonderful if every child could read to someone at home **at least two times a week**. Please could you sign the Home School diary when you have heard your child read. If your child does not have two signatures in their Home School diary, they will be kept in during homework club to read.
- As ever, we will be continuing to focus on times tables. Please practise your child's target times table with them every week.
- Homework will continue to be given on a Monday and needs to be handed in by Friday (with the exception of spellings which will be given on a Friday). This term, the maths homework will usually consist of some Active Learn activities – if your child does not have access to the internet at home, then they will be given the opportunity to complete their homework at school.
English homework will consist of weekly spellings to learn and related activities.
