Writing and SPAG Re

We will be following the Talk for Writing approach covering a fiction unit. We will be learning the story of Jack and the Hungry Dragon, focussing on the structure of a journey story. The children will create a story map of the model text and will come up with actions to help them learn the text off by heart. They will identify the features of this particular story, before writing an alternative version independently.

Reading

Children will continue to have lots of opportunity to read at school. This will include reading to an adult, as well as paired and guided reading. Identifying new vocabulary and its meaning will continue to be a focus, as well as using VIPERS to answer a range of questions. We will also focus on improving our fluency when reading. We will continue to read our Year 1 spine books, as well as books and poems about animals.

Maths

Our first unit is Multiplication and Division. We will begin by learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s, making and adding equal groups, making arrays and doubling. The children will get lots of opportunities to apply their new skills when solving word problems.

Next we will be learning about Fractions. We will find halves and quarters of numbers, shapes and objects. Much of this work will be done in a

PHSE/RSE

We will be focusing on the unit 'Being my Best'.
We will investigate what this means for us. The children will learn about the importance of 'eating a rainbow,' regular hygiene routines, as well as strategies for resolving conflict situations. The children will consider when they learn a new skill, they will need to practice it and may face failure along the way.

Science

We will continue our work on Animals, where we will investigate the features that are present in specific animal groups. The children will then compare the animal groups. We will also group animals according to their diet and the children will learn the terms: herbivore, carnivore and omnivore. We will also

consider seasonal changes in

our local environment.

History

Our learning will be focussed around our big question: 'How have seaside holidays changed in the last 100 years? Children will get the chance to look at a variety of sources, including photographs, to compare and contrast modern seaside holidays with Victorian seaside holidays. Each lesson will begin with an enquiry question for the children to answer at the end of each lesson.

RF

We will continue learning about Judaism and consider the question: Who is Jewish and how do they live? We will be finding out about what it means to be Jewish, their beliefs and some of their traditions. Each lesson will begin with an enquiry question for the children to answer at the end of each lesson.

This term, our unit is called **IProgram.** We will learn to program toys in order for them to move. The children will learn how to give a sequence of instructions to programmable toys, as well as directional commands to virtual toys.

Music

The unit is called 'Your Imagination.' The children will get the chance to listen to and appraise music, as well as use musical instruments.
