

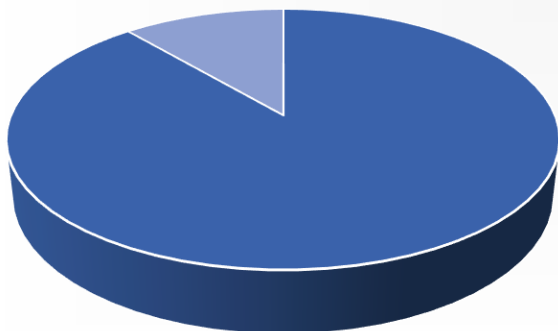
Parent/Carer Survey – July 2024

In the Summer Term, we asked for parent/carers feedback through a survey. Families could respond differently for each of their children, ensuring that we understood the different perspectives that might occur within a family of more than one child at the school. The survey could be anonymous and given in at the office, but most families chose to return the paper survey to the class teacher.

The questions are those that Ofsted ask during an inspection. There were thirteen questions with a choice of various responses: Strongly Agree, Agree, Disagree, Strongly Agree, I am not sure/This is not relevant. In addition, there was space for comments at the end.

The pie charts in this report give an overview of the answers and we hope that this representation helps everyone to understand the responses which we have received.

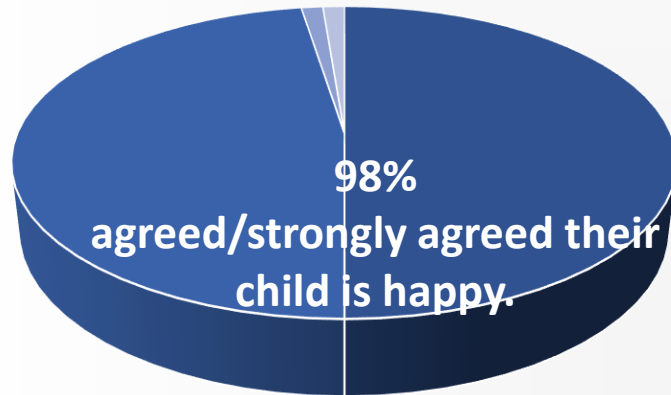

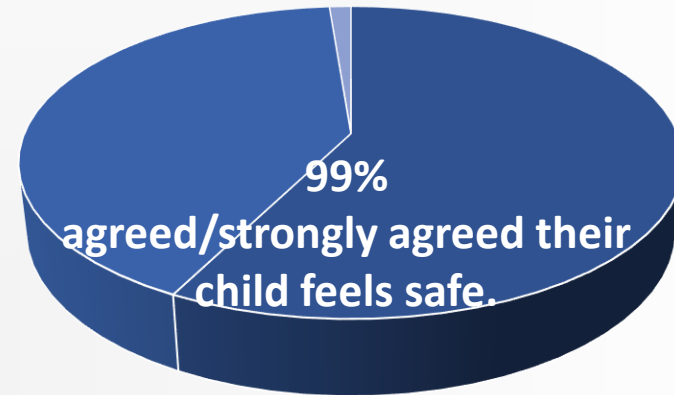

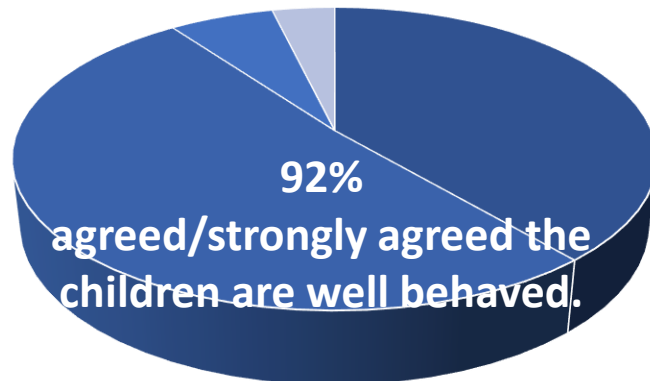

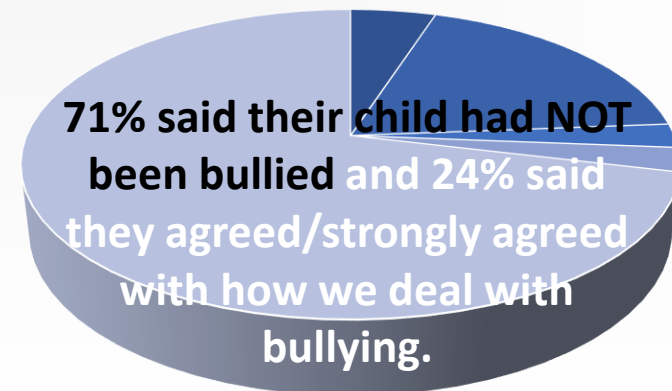
My child feels safe at Saint John's

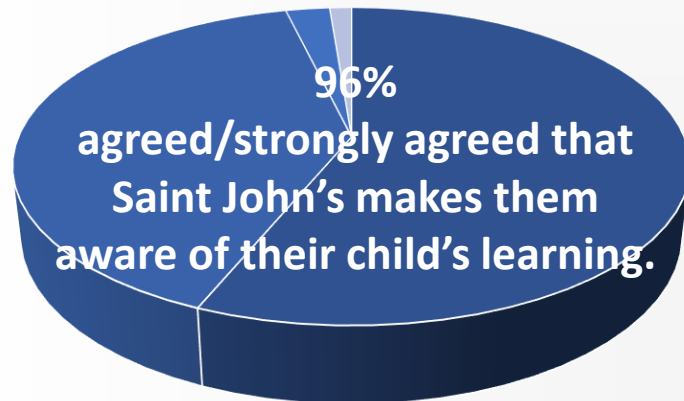

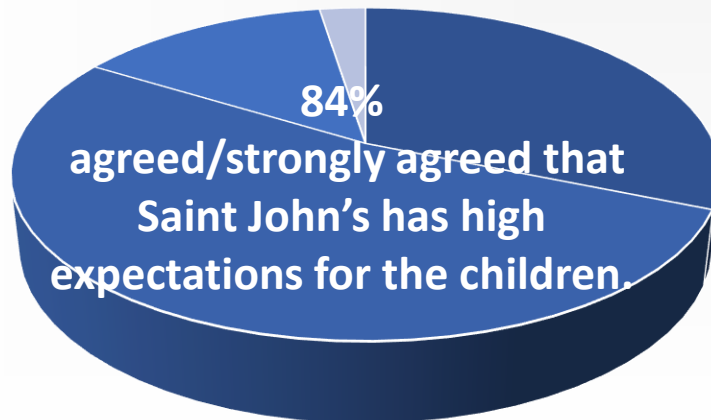

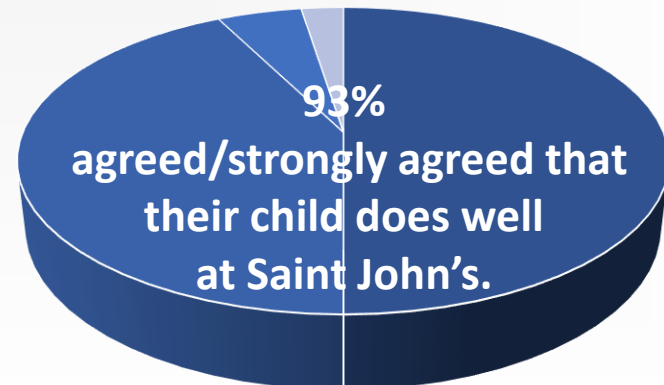

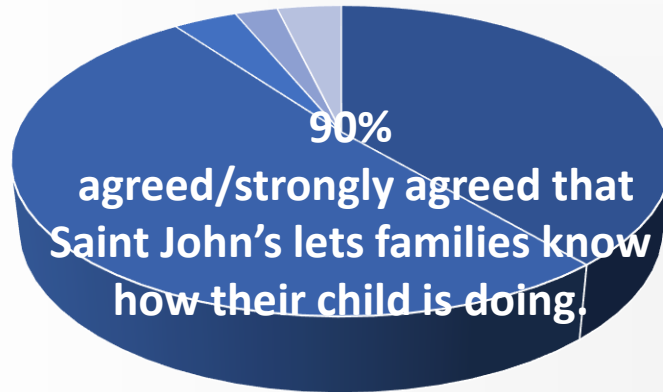

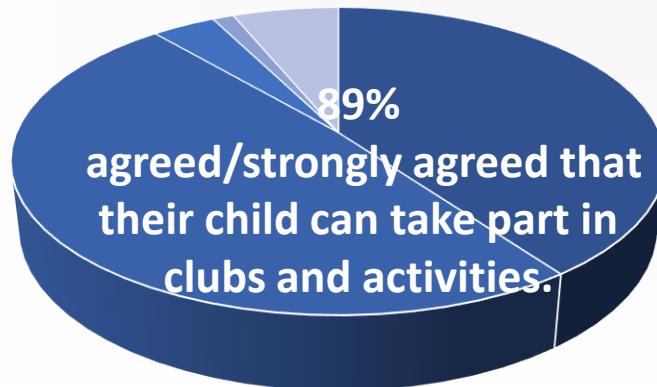

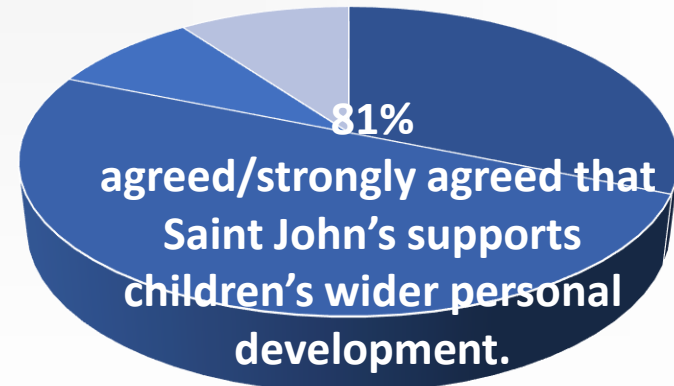

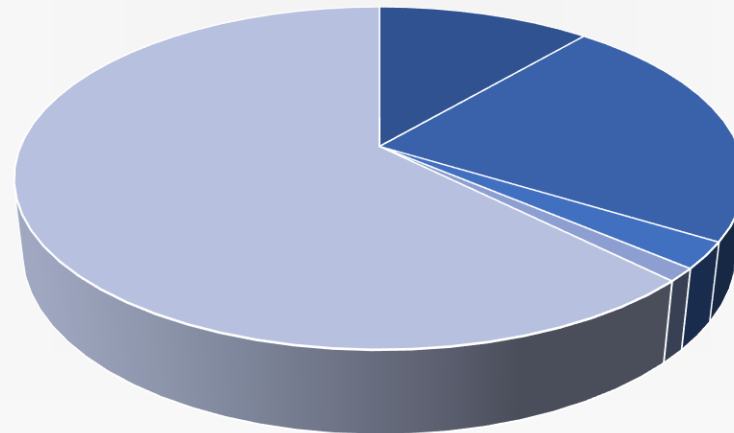

SEND = Special Educational Needs or Disabilities

My child has SEND and Saint John's gives them the support they need to succeed.



**63% of the responders said their child does not have SEND.
Our records note that we have under 15% of pupils with SEND.**

Of those who have a child with SEND, 90% agreed/strongly agreed their child was supported.

Parent/Carer Survey – Summer 2024 Reflections

We are hugely encouraged by the number of responses we received for this survey. It is always helpful to receive much feedback from parents and carers. We are also very pleased that there was a high percentage of the responses which were either strongly agree or agree – and we feel this is a recognition of the work that we are doing to ensure our children flourish at Saint John's.

Of course, there are always things to learn and to improve. We continue to work on ways we can ensure pupils and parents/carers know how to raise concerns and to respond to these appropriately.

We have improved our communications and this has helped – but we recognise that it can be difficult for some parents/carers to find ways to communicate.

We encourage any parent/carers to contact via Dojo or email/phone the office, if they have any concerns about their child at school.

In the survey, there was an opportunity to add further comments and a number of families did so. The comments are helpful as they give more detail as to any concerns and we will reflect on these and consider possible actions in response.

Many of the comments were incredibly positive and the staff are touched by both individual and general comments made about the work we do at Saint John's.

The responses to the question about behaviour and bullying were the most encouraging, as there has been considerable development with these areas over these last few months/years. In previous surveys, parents/carers had commented that they did not know if the children were well behaved nor whether bullying was dealt with quickly and effectively. This time, it seems clear that families feel more confident in how things are managed in school.

We feel that behaviour overall has improved and this is seen both by our own staff and by the visitors who come into school or who see our children out and about on trips. In terms of eradicating bullying, this continues to be a focus. Our aim is that no child is ever bullied during their time at Saint John's. However, with the world we live in, it is fundamental that we help children, and their families, understand about behaviour and bullying and that we are doing all that we can to support any difficult moments our children might have at school.
