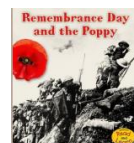
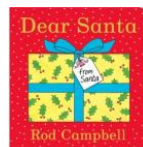
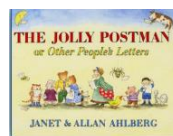
Diwali - A Hindu celebration of light. A festival to remember the story of Rama and Sita.
