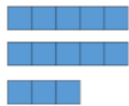
Use the models to write equivalent fractions.

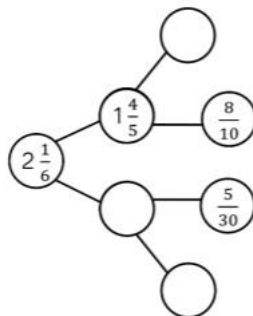
Problem Solving:

$$2 \frac{\square}{5} = \frac{\square}{5}$$

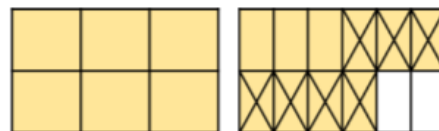
Complete the part-whole model.
