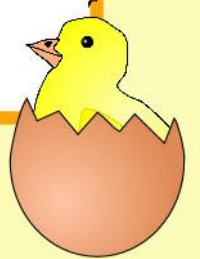
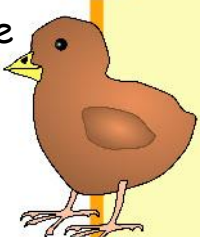
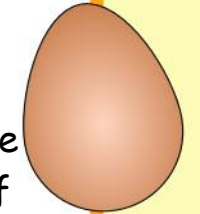
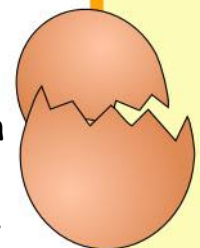
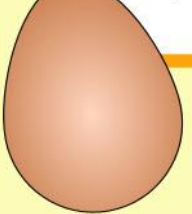
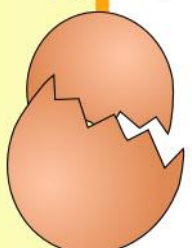
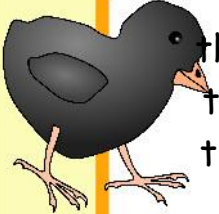
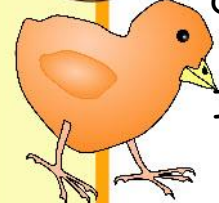
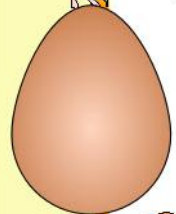
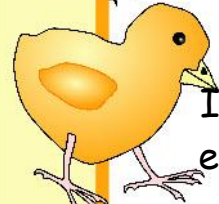


Welcome Back!

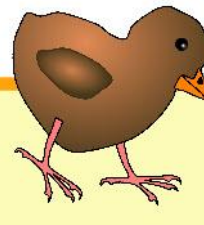
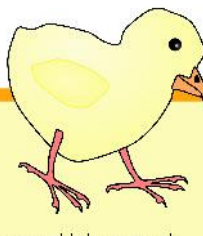


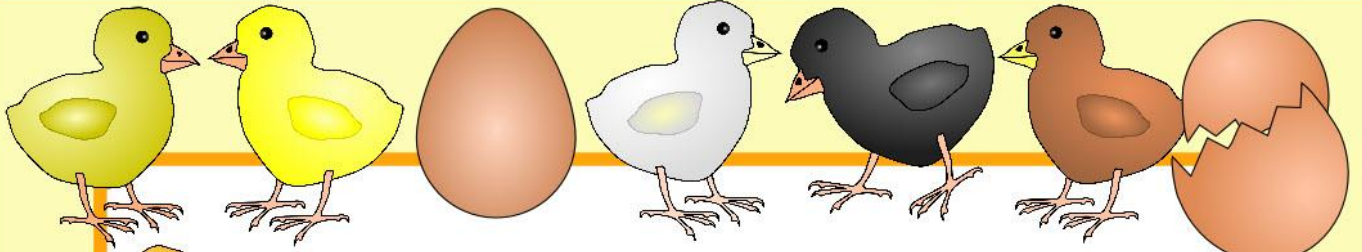
Our Topic for this term is 'Eggs', with our key question 'Which animals hatch out of eggs?'

I have included a Knowledge Organiser and the Termly Overview, which provides a brief overview and introduces some of the vocabulary we will be using during our sessions. This term, we will have some extra special visitors in our class. We will be hatching chicks and looking after them for 2 weeks before they go back to live on the farm. Our eggs will arrive with an incubator plus a brooder box to house them in. Once their feathers have dried and fluffed up, we will be able to hold the chicks but no one will have to hold a chick if they are not keen! I have attached the website for the company who are providing the hatching programme. They "ethically place all chicks at the end of the programme."

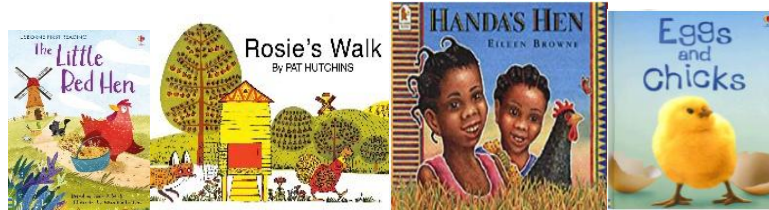

Taking away including first, then, now stories.

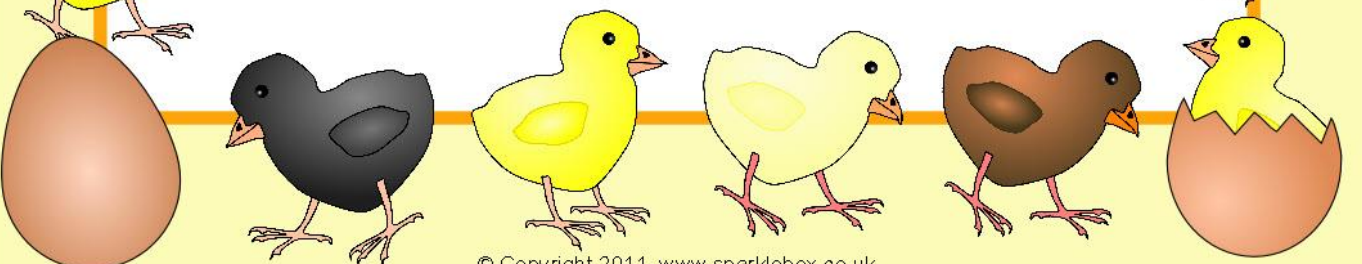
Making patterns with shapes including using tangrams.

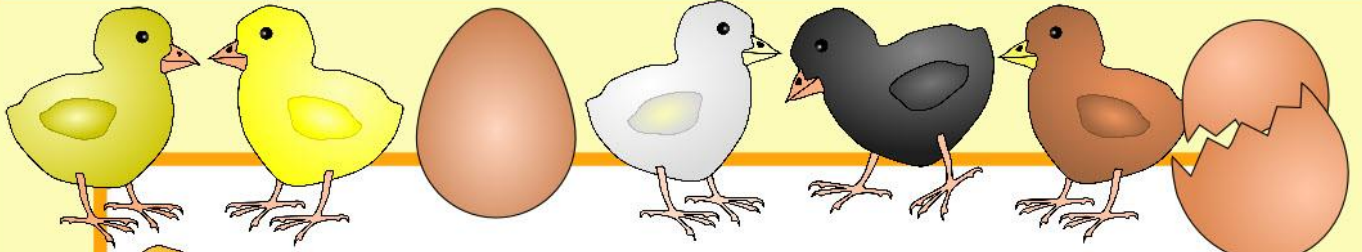
Here are some of the texts we will be using in our learning:
