

Parent/Carer Survey – Summer 2026

In the Summer Term, we asked for parent/carers feedback through a survey. Families could respond differently for each of their children, ensuring that we understood the different perspectives that might occur within a family of more than one child at the school. The survey could be anonymous and given in at the office, but many families chose to return the paper survey to the class teacher.

The questions are those that Ofsted ask during an inspection. There were 10 questions with a choice of various responses: Strongly Agree, Agree, Neither Agree nor Disagree, Disagree, Strongly Disagree, I am not sure. There was a final question asking if families would recommend the school to other parents. There was space for comments on the second side of the paper.

The pie charts in this report give an overview of the answers and we hope that representing the information in this way helps everyone to understand the responses which we have received.

We had many positive responses about the school, individual members of staff and the arrangements in place for the children.

We are delighted by the positives and will keep addressing areas of need and/or development.

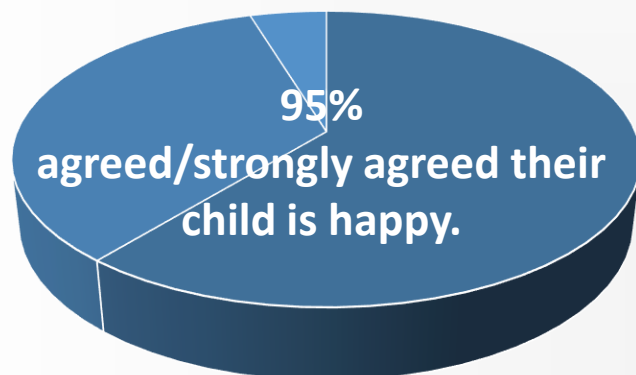

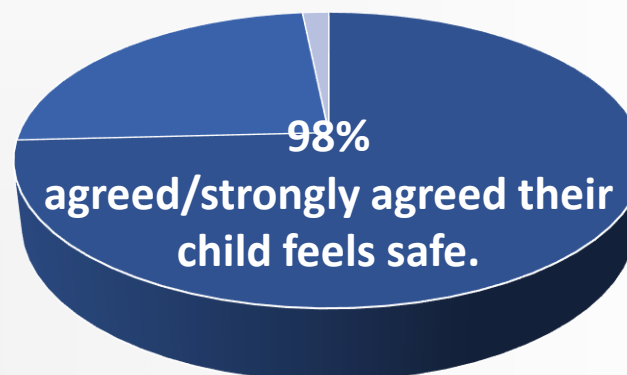

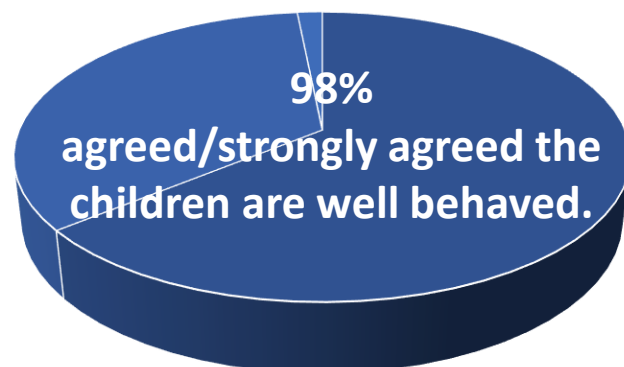

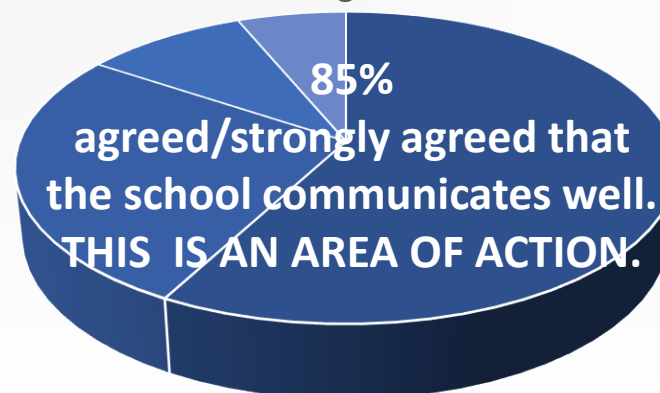
2. My child feels safe at Saint John's

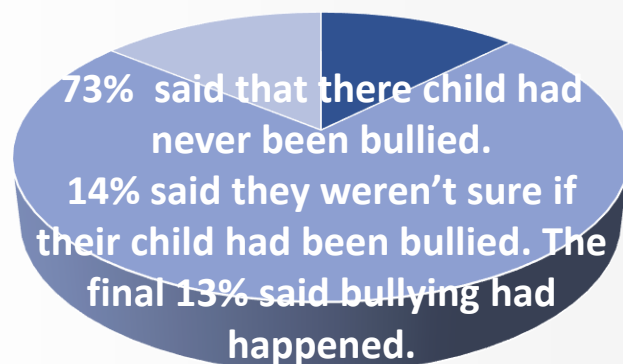

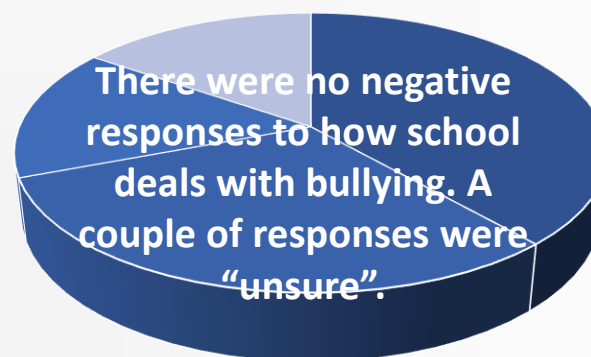

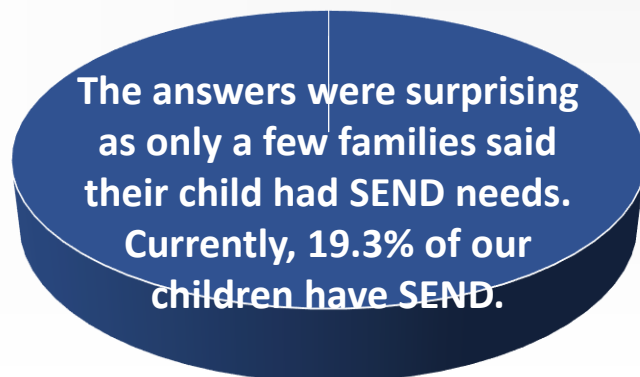
4. My child has been bullied at Saint John's.

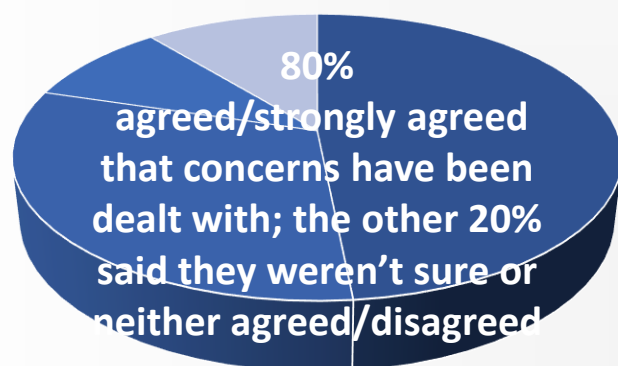

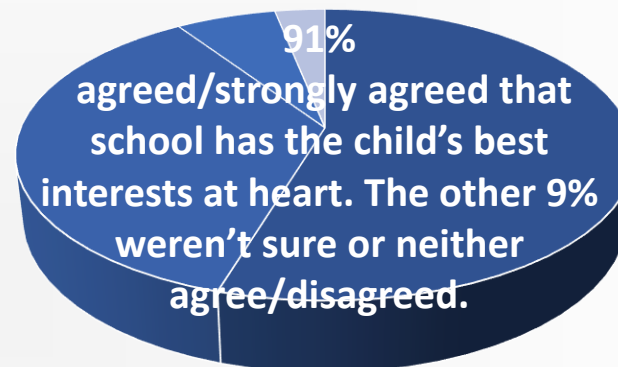

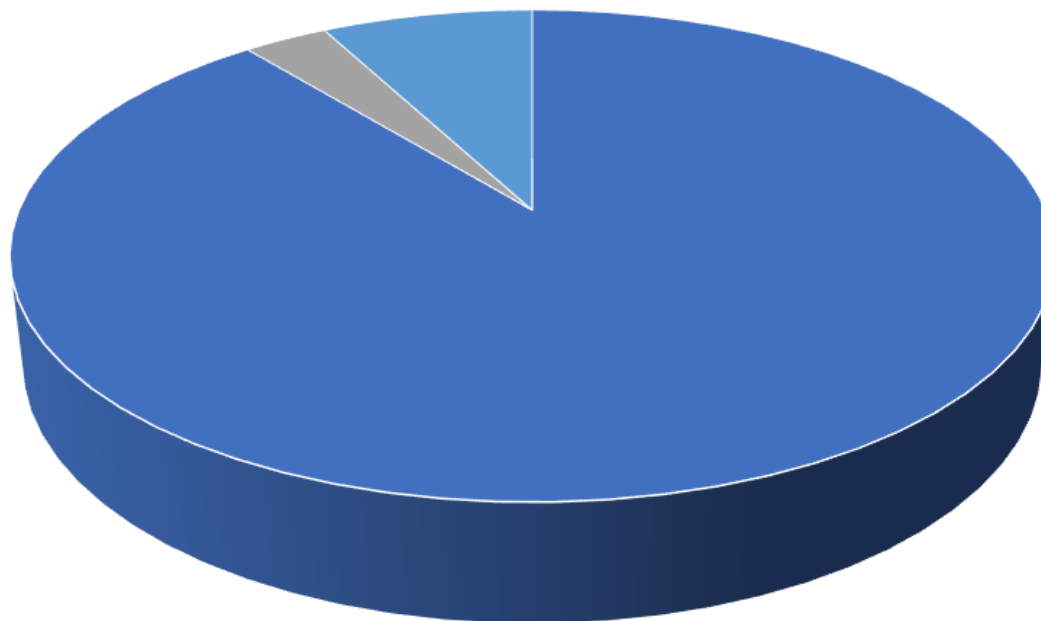

We are really encouraged by the number of responses we received for this survey. It is always helpful to receive feedback from parents and carers. We are also very pleased that there was a very high percentage of strongly agree or agree responses. This helps us to be confident in the work we are doing to ensure our children flourish at Saint John's.

There are always things to learn and to improve. We continue to work on ways we can ensure pupils and parents/carers know how to raise concerns and to respond to these appropriately.

Things that parents/carers said we were doing well:

- The academic side
- Visitors, trips and special days
- The interaction between year groups
- Behaviour and positive attitudes of children
- The Christian ethos and values
- Cyber safety information and workshops

Staff were described as:

- Enthusiastic
- Caring
- Supportive
- Approachable
- Kind

The areas that families suggested we develop:

- Building further confidence in speaking and sharing ideas
 - Careers and thinking about jobs and the workplace
- We have these in mind and are looking at ways we might do this over this next year.

One area of concern was the size of the playground, lack of green space and wanting more physical clubs.

We recognise this as a concern for families and have increased clubs, improved our outside spaces and continued to access to spaces such as the cricket club and Cheltenham College; however, sadly we cannot change the size of our playgrounds!

Other areas of concern were:

- Wanting more school trips and better school dinners
- We continue to review school trips whilst being mindful of the finances of the school and of families. We have worked hard to ensure dinners are hotter and more tasty and will continue to speak with the catering company.
