Ask and answer questions such as: 'what was it like for a?', 'what happened in the past?', 'how long ago did happen?', Estimate the ages of people by studying and describing their features. Describe objects, people and events. Write own date of birth. Write simple stories and recounts about the past. Draw labelled diagrams and write about them to tell others about people, events and objects from the past.
