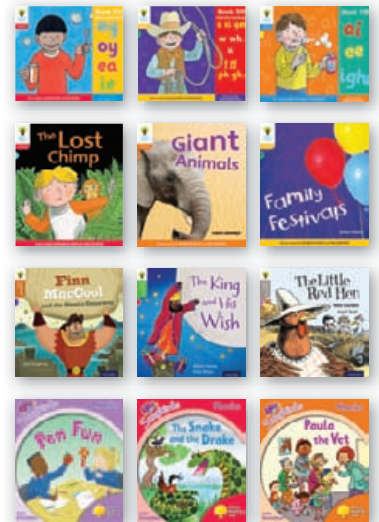
1. Children should be taught to read using a rigorous and structured scaffold

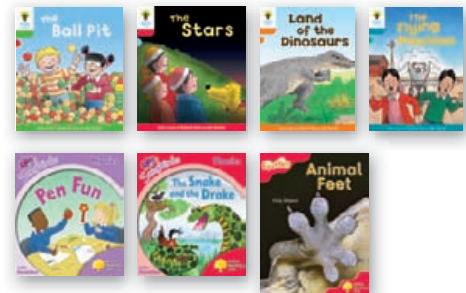
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3. Children should be able to discuss, elaborate and explain their understanding and ideas
