The Vikings and Anglo Saxons The shallow draft of Viking ships enabled them to travel further afield. The spread of the Vikings, including Norse men, then invaded England in 1066.	The Victorians Wealthy families continued to move and settle in new places, including Cheltenham, which was deemed to be a desirable location due to its residential, spiritual and educational advantages. World War II Damage from bombing meant some people would have located to other parts of the country including Cheltenham.
