Writing and SPAG

We will be looking at Pie Corbett's "Kidnapped!" - a narrative with the structure of a quest. The narrative will also have a focus on suspense, so we will develop a toolkit that will help us write our own narrative with this in mind.

Following this, we will use our key text to help us revisit newspaper articles, allowing us to develop and consolidate our writing skills for this purpose.

Learning through Locality
