Class book

Our class book this term is 'The girl who speaks bear' by Sophie Anderson which is a story about a young girl Yanka, who flees her house, looking for answers about who she really is. Yanka embarks on an extraordinary journey as she travels through icy rivers to smouldering mountains and meets an ever-growing herd of extraordinary friends along the way.

Termly topic and project

We will be learning about the Mayas this term and will endeavour to answer the question: Why were the Mayas top of the class? In previous years, children have enjoyed sharing their Mayan projects with children in the same class as well as in other year groups, as it provides them with an opportunity to showcase their independent learning to others. We would like our current Year 5 to

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benefit from the same opportunity and therefore invite them to bring their end-of term projects about an aspect of Maya civilisation **on Monday 23rd October 2023.** Children can choose one or two of the following aspects for their projects:

- 1. Famous Maya cites and buildings
- 2. Mayan food/ Cocoa beans and chocolate
- 3. Mayan houses/clothes
- 4. Mayan religious beliefs
- 5. Frederick Catherwood

Children can choose from one of the following formats to present their learning:

- Write a non-chronological report.
- A powerpoint presentation. Children should avoid putting too much writing on the slides instead they should use bullet points, pictures and prompts on the slides to expand on each bullet point in their own words.
- A 3D model with a detailed written explanation of the chosen aspect.
- A poster/ a minibook /a leaflet.

We will also be having a **Maya Day** during Term 1 on Thursday **5**th **October** during which children will have the opportunity to dress up as Mayans and take part in a variety of activities to experience what life was like as a Maya. Although dressing-up is optional, we would love as many children as possible to dress up. Please do not feel you need to buy something new as the outfits can be made out of old bed sheets or scraps of material. Please see the attached pictures for costume suggestions.
