

I hope you have all have had lovely half term break.


Our key question for this term is:

We will also continue to have fun on the bikes, scooters and large wheeled toys. Please bring a helmet from home if you would like your child to wear one.










On Thursday mornings, we will be exploring the outside and different textures during our 'messy play' session.
