Homework

Please continue to ensure your child reads every night. Reading at home could be shared reading with an adult, reading to themselves or collaborative reading where they read a section and then an adult reads a section. It is also important that the children discuss what they have read on a regular basis to ensure that they have understood what they are reading. We have a focus on developing reading fluency, so encouraging children to re-read sections or pages again is a great way to help this. Once they have finished their books, please sign their reading record book and then they can change them at school the following day. **It is important their book bags are in school every day**, so they are able to read to an adult.

Your child will be given a list of spellings every Friday to learn for a test the following Friday. We would encourage the children to put each word into a sentence. This will ensure that they understand the meaning of the words they are learning to spell.

PE

Our PE days will remain on a Monday and Wednesday afternoon. Please can we remind you that the children are expected to wear their coloured house t-shirt (these can be purchased for £2 from the school office if a replacement is required), black/blue shorts or joggers and their school jumper along with trainers.
