Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to another exciting term in Year 5. The children have arrived focused and enthusiastic to learn and we are looking forward to a busy term ahead. Our key question this term is:

How do forests in England compare to the forests in Scandinavia?

In this geography topic, we will embark on a fascinating journey of discovery by locating Scandinavian countries on a world map and identifying some of its main features through exploring a variety of images and online mapping. We will also learn about Scandinavian biomes along with the climate and weather of Scandinavia and then use this knowledge to compare and contrast forests in England to those in Scandinavia.

Science

In Science, children will be learning about **Earth and Space** and children will have the opportunity to visit a mobile planetarium on Science Day (Wednesday 6th March).

Project

Last term, we were impressed by how hard children had worked to create some truly creative and imaginative projects. Thank you to all of the families who support their children in completing high quality homework and projects. The topic for our project this term is **Earth and Space** and children can choose from one of the following for their projects:

- Research and create a factfile about the solar system.
- A powerpoint presentation about planets, phases of the moon, asteroids or meteorites. Children should avoid putting too much writing on the slides – instead they should use bullet points, pictures and prompts on the slides to expand on each bullet point in their own words).
- A non-chronological report explaining moon landings, latest discoveries about the solar system.
- A poster/ a minibook /a leaflet about the formation of day and night and seasons.
- Create a piece of art/3D model about the solar system/ night and day/seasons.
- A factfile about an astronaut of their choice such as Neil Armstrong, Sally Ride or Tim Peake.
- A letter from Mars to your friend explaining what life is like on Mars.

Projects should be brought into school on **Monday 18th March 2024** for sharing in class.

PE

PE lessons this term are on **Mondays and Fridays**. On these days, children should come to school wearing their PE kits instead of their usual school uniform. Track suits (navy or black) with trainers and sweatshirts for outdoor PE would be great!
